BELL NEWS

The Hands of Harmony bell choir will be attending the "Spring Ring" festival on Saturday, March 21st.



The Lansing Area Ministry of Bells (L.A.M.B.), under the direction of Susan Berry of Dearborn, will present its 31st Annual Spring Ring on Saturday, March 21, 2015, at 4:30 p.m. at South Church's gymnasium (5250 Cornerstone Dr., Lansing, off Snow Rd., south of I–496). This facility is handicapper–accessible.

Susan Berry is returning to the podium to conduct this year's Spring Ring. She is a well-known authority on handbell ringing, a popular clinician at handbell events at all levels, and the author of Healthy Ringing. She is the president of Handbell Services, Inc., and was a representative for Malmark Handbells for over 30 years. The theme of the concert is "Ringing Through the Year—A Celebration of Church Seasons" and handbell arrangements of music of the church year (Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, Advent, and Christmas) will be featured. About 100 ringers from 10 choirs will join together for massed ringing; solo numbers will also be played. The concert is free and open to the public. We hope you'll attend this annual handbell music event. A freewill offering will be collected.

CHURCH GOVERNANCE - REVISION OF BYLAWS

For more than a year, a committee of the Board of Ministry has studied and revised parts of the governing documents for the body of believers. The resulting document is being recommended to you for discussion (on Sunday, March 8) and for voting (on Sunday, March 22).

Because this set of documents contains vision and mission, as well as bylaws, we want as many people to look over the document as possible, but voting will be limited to members. If you are not sure of your membership status, please contact the church office so we can check the books.

Faith in Jesus, Faith of Jesus

As Christians we know about God—his character, purpose, and passion—primarily through the person of Jesus. For us he is Immanuel¹, God with us; one who lived as we live. We tell the story of Jesus, and have faith in Jesus.

What about the faith of Jesus? What can he, "the word made flesh that dwelt among us" 2, teach us about living out faith in God? What did it mean for him, as one who "taking the very nature of a servant" walked as we do, day by day, with his Heavenly Father, in ministry? What was in Jesus' mind? What dilemmas did he face? What difficult choices did he make in his ministry? What were Jesus' troubles, motives, faith questions?

During Lent we are exploring the faith of Jesus in a series of sermons titled, "Whole Hearted Faith". I chose that title because that is what Jesus had; faith that involved his whole self to the core. Our guide for this series is the gospel writer John. We will take the seven signs John uses to point up the meaning of Jesus' ministry and examine each one for the faith questions of Jesus as he moves toward the cross and Easter. I encourage you to read John, called by Martin Luther, "Chiefest of the Gospels" by way of preparation.

Let's learn from the Lord what it means to have a whole hearted faith.

Notes from the Director of the Music Ministry: **Riffs are our Theme**

If you've been paying attention, you've noticed that the Music Ministry Team has been riffing on a theme of discernment this year. Riffs are brief melodies that musicians repeat and change little by little as they search for the melody that will lead forward. To riff is to create in the moment. Our team is responding to changes such as a choir director stepping down, a talented pianist arriving, schedule changes inhibiting direct participation on the ministry team, new additions to the bell choir swelling to overflow the loft ... It's dynamic! Exciting! Confusing! Fatiguing!

Our experience of the past 6 months has meant riffing as we re–assess our mission and goals as a team. Our over-arching sense of purpose and opportunity includes the following:

- Support the ministry of worship music by revitalizing our worship music, supporting FCC musicians who serve out of their musical gifts, and thereby supporting the congregation who comes to worship.
- Increase the opportunities for FCC to extend hospitality by prioritizing spiritual growth and unity. 2.
- Support leadership development of FCC musicians and others who are called to join us.

We are making progress, and ask your continued prayers as we continue to discern. If you feel drawn to join this Ministry Team, please talk to our Chairperson, Beth Webb.

Another form of riffing on all of these themes is our combined effort to build an Easter cantata. We are choosing music from our files, writing the narrative, and looking for readers. This is a collective act of faith, as we serve out of and develop our gifts, follow our sense of call, and try to honor the story.

And it is at this time that God has opened a door for me— a chance to work part-time, locally, as a hospice music therapist. This is holy, challenging work. It is work that I have been waiting for. And my heart wants to honor all opportunities: in music ministry, in teaching and accompanying, and in music therapy. In my discernment, I am asking what I need to set aside so that everyone involved can grow.

This is a lot of riffing! We are grateful for the opportunities that God continues to send. Please pray for us as we continue to actively seek and to follow God's guidance.


